RESOLUTION NO. 2009-28

A RESOLUTION OF THE DILLINGHAM CITY COUNCIL APPROVING A GRANT FROM THE SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the goal of improving pedestrian paths for Dillingham has been on the Capital Improvement Projects list for many years; and,

WHEREAS, infrastructure improvements are needed to make the routes to school safer and nicer for children to walk and ride their bicycles to school; and,

WHEREAS, the Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant will assist the community in promoting walking and bicycling to school; and,

WHEREAS, the health of children and adults will benefit through these improvements to pedestrian pathways in Dillingham; and,

WHEREAS, if more children walk and bicycle to school pollution from cars at the entrances to the schools will decrease; and,

WHEREAS, these habits can lead to improvements in self-care that last a lifetime; and,

WHEREAS, the SRTS grant will assist the Planning Commission and the schools in identifying ways to improve the routes that children take to get to school; and,


WHEREAS, a pedestrian path is needed to connect the Tower Road project and the Downtown Streets road projects;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Dillingham City Council approves the Safe Routes to School Grant for \$5,000.


